The requirement for entrance into Law School is the successful completion of a Bachelor's degree in any field. A student desiring to major in Law is advised to select an undergraduate field that is of specific interest and pursue that objective to the completion of a Bachelor's degree.

This suggested curriculum includes degree requirements and courses that are usually completed in the first two years of a four-year curriculum. Consult with the university or college of your choice and its catalog curriculum as you make plans on where to transfer. Be careful to select the courses that will meet all requirements for both the Associate and Baccalaureate degree programs.

NOC evaluates students for placement into either foundational or college-level courses, whichever will lead to the greatest possibility of student success.
