The purpose of the Associate in Applied Science in Applied Technology - Military Science Option is to provide an avenue through which members of the Armed Forces may apply experiential training earned while on active duty within one of the branches of the U.S. Military toward degree completion. Students will be requested to provide an official transcript from their respective branch of service.

NOC evaluates students for placement into either foundational or college-level courses, whichever will lead to the greatest possibility of student success. Academic placement is determined either by ACT test scores or by COMPASS test scores. These tests are administered by the Testing Center at NOC. Based upon the scores, some or all of the following six (6) courses may need to be taken:

- MATH 0003 Pre-Algebra
- MATH 0023 Concepts of Algebra
- MATH 0123 Intermediate Algebra
- ENGL 0123 Basic Composition
- READ 0123 Basic Reading
- BSCI 0123 Intro to Basic Science
